Dear Parishioners,

With the Summer Olympics going on, I am reminded of the words of Saint Paul, who in his letters often compares the Christian life to the life of athletes training for competition. The most frequent analogy he uses is that of the runner in the stadium: "Lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith (Hebrews 12:1-2)." Endurance through the difficulties and temptations of life is important to growing in Christian perfection. Saint Paul teaches that if we persevere to the end, the reward we will win, rather than medals or the laurel crowns which ancient Olympians used to wear in victory, will be the reward heaven: "Do you not know that the runners in the stadium all run in the race, but only one wins the prize? Run so as to win. Every athlete exercises discipline in every way. They do it to win a perishable crown, but we an imperishable one (1 Corinthians 9:24-25)."

In the race of life, we all grow weary, and the devil will lay obstacles for us to trip up on. This is why, with prayer and good works, fasting and penances, we train our bodies as well as our souls. We live this life so as to live eternally, and we run the race not just for the sake of it, but as Saint Paul says, we "run to win." Perseverance is important, because this race of life has winners and losers. As Jesus Himself warns us, we must persevere in the faith until death if we want to go to heaven: "the one who perseveres to the end will be saved (Matthew 24:13)."

In the whatever hurdles we experience on the race track of life, all we need to do is ask for the grace to overcome them. Jesus knows that we will trip up from time to time, but it is important that we keep going, knowing that he runs besides us always.

In other news, I look forward to seeing you all at the Miltonsburg picnic. I hope it will be a good time of food and fraternity for our community. Please also remember in your prayers our 10 seminarians who will be going on retreat this week in Hocking Hills, that God may open the eyes of their hearts to discern His will, and keep them running strong in the race He has set before them.
