

Fr. Tim assured me that you all behaved yourselves while I was away. I did enjoy my "time off" – weddings are beautiful events, especially those weddings graced by the bond of the sacrament of a Christian marriage.

As I was making my rounds Wednesday, one of our shut-ins who I was visiting with told me that President Carter was going to turn 100 years old on October 1st, which would make him the oldest person who had ever been President of the United States.

Of course, our country has changed so much since Carter was President, let alone since Carter was born back in 1924. Our world is truly a different place than it was twenty, fifty, or even ten years ago. Change is inevitable. Sadly, some changes are for the worse; our society as it has gradually shifted from traditional Christian values has seemed to become increasingly more irreverent, hedonistic, selfish and violent. The concept of marriage, human sexuality, things so basic and fundamental to human society have completely eroded. Human life, so precious, is constantly devalued by those who commit atrocities in the name of free choice. Rights are demanded by all, but duties are disregarded universally.

In this sad state of our Republic, we are faced yet again with a polarizing election. While neither candidate perfectly conforms their platforms to the tradition and teaching of the Church, we are nonetheless invited to vote for the sake of the common good and according to our Catholic conscience. I invite you to vote as Mother Angelica constantly encouraged her viewers on EWTN, keeping first and foremost in mind the sanctity of human life and the atrocity of abortion. As long as the unborn child is seen as an inconvenience rather than a blessing, as long as the vulnerable are seen as less than human, as long as murder in the womb is tolerated, we will be a society of death rather than a culture of life.

However we vote, we must keep our discourse civil. We are all familiar with the two attempts on former President Trump's life. Whatever your opinion of the man, we are called to be people of peace, and called to promote the ideals of Christ's Kingdom before all others. Hatred inevitably leads to violence. This is why Our Lord calls us to love, even our enemies. Hopefully each of us, in our words and actions, can do our part in bringing Christ's peace to our world and country, trusting in the words of Jesus, the Prince of Peace, over the philosophies of the princes of this world.

From Pope Francis: "Lord, God of Abraham, God of the Prophets, God of Love, you created us and you call us to live as brothers and sisters. Give us the strength daily to be instruments of peace; enable us to see everyone who crosses our path as our brother or sister. Make us sensitive to the plea of our citizens who entreat us to turn our weapons of war into implements of peace, our trepidation into confident trust, and our quarreling into forgiveness."
