Dear Parishioners.

It was such a blessing for me to celebrate the Christmas Masses with you and your families in our beautifully decorated churches this year. I hope your holiday celebrations are going off without a hitch.

We have to keep the party going. Christmas is an octave: an eight-day celebration. Traditionally, we also speak of the "Twelve days of Christmas" from Christmas day until the traditional date of the Feast of the Epiphany. January 6th. In the New Calendar, the Christmas season lasts until the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. So, whichever way you count, there's still more celebrating to do.

This weekend's celebration, the Feast of the Holy Family, calls us to look upon Jesus, Mary, and Joseph with love and admiration. God has purposefully designed, in his plan of history, to begin all things with the family. Before there was the Church, before there were the twelve disciples, there was the Holy Family. This is true in the New Testament as it was in the Old: The story of mankind on this earth also began with a family, Adam and Eve, though their story ran a bit sadder: Eve betrayed Adam's trust by allowing herself to be seduced by Satan's lies. Adam failed to protect Eve from the serpent, and told God that Eve tricked him. One of their children ended up murdering the other. How could things have gone so wrong, so soon?

The same things which corrupted the first family, jealousy, hatred, dishonesty, disloyalty, and disobedience, are things which continue to hurt and divide our families today as well. Thankfully we have the model of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph to show us the way to holiness in our households, through mutual love, obedience to God, patience, and kindness.

In his letter to the Ephesians (5:21-6:4), Saint Paul gives us some good advice for health, happiness, and holiness in the family. I hope you will find it good reading, and that the life of each of your families will increasingly mirror the love and joy of the Holy Family.
