Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord.

Dear Parishioners,

On this solemnity of Christ the King, we are invited to reflect on what Christ's rulership over the Universe looks like. I think a lot of people today ask where God is, or why God doesn't take a heavier hand in managing the world. Why doesn't the King of the Universe fix all of our problems? Why doesn't he cure childhood illness? Why doesn't he end world hunger? Why doesn't he put an end to all these destructive wars?

We might recall that God did in fact come to cure the sick, feed the multitudes, and preach peace and love, and we ended up nailing Him to a cross.

The fact is that we want to have it both ways. We want to have all the power and control over our lives and make our own decisions, and we also want to blame God when it goes all wrong. This is exactly what Adam does when, after God created a perfect paradise for him to live in, blames God for something he himself did. "The woman you put here with me; she gave me the fruit (Genesis 3:12)" Adam says, as if to say "It's your fault! You sent me the woman! How dare you let me disobey you!"

We are arrogant and ungrateful creatures. Our arrogance, willfulness, and pride make us subjects of Satan rather than citizens of heaven. While our King calls us "friends" (John 15:15), Satan has no friends. Satan regards other rational creatures in only one of two ways: either as slaves, or as enemies. It was this arrogance which made us slaves to sin and Satan and which corrupted this world of ours, made by God to be our paradise.

When Jesus says to Pilate "My Kingdom is not of this world (John 18:36)", he points to three realities: First, that God has given man what he has wanted: control over the world that God made and rejection of the selfsame God. But the third truth is that Jesus' kingdom transcends this world. The Kingdom of God is not subject to human weakness like this earthly kingdom, and insofar as we follow Christ, making Him our King, we become citizens of that kingdom which is not subject to corruption, but will last for all time.

I hope, given the choice of kings set before us, the prince of this world or the King of Heaven, we will all choose the latter. It will require us to humble ourselves to follow this King. We must humble our sinful pride to serve Him where Satan would not, to love Him as the Jews would not, to follow Him where so many abandoned Him. But since Jesus has first humbled himself to serve us, how can we not humble ourselves to honor and worship him? Who will you choose to rule in your heart?

In the end, we cannot choose to be our own master. We will be either be servants of God or slaves of Satan. Which one will you take as your King?
