Dear Parishioners,

October begins this week. We typically think of fall, football, Halloween, etc. when we think of October. Traditionally, October is the month that is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. While Our Lady, from her apparitions in Fatima, teaches us to pray the rosary every day, this is a month where we should renew our devotion to this most excellent prayer, especially if we have lapsed in our duty to pray the rosary regularly.

In 2008 the late great Pope Benedict XVI gave an excellent reflection on the rosary on the occasion of his visit to the Major Basilica of Saint Mary Major. Here is an excerpt from it:

"The Holy Rosary is not a pious practice banished to the past, like prayers of other times thought of with nostalgia. Instead, the Rosary is experiencing a new Springtime. Without a doubt, this is one of the most eloquent signs of love that the young generation nourish for Jesus and his Mother, Mary. In the current world, so dispersive, this prayer helps to put Christ at the center, as the Virgin did, who meditated within all that was said about her Son, and also what he did and said. When reciting the Rosary, the important and meaningful moments of salvation history are relived. The various steps of Christ's mission are traced. With Mary the heart is oriented toward the mystery of Jesus. Christ is put at the center of our life, of our time, of our city, through the contemplation and meditation of his holy mysteries of joy, light, sorrow and glory. May Mary help us to welcome within ourselves the grace emanating from these mysteries, so that through us we can "water" society, beginning with our daily relationships, and purifying them from so many negative forces, thus opening them to the newness of God. The Rosary, when it is prayed in an authentic way, not mechanical and superficial but profoundly, it brings, in fact, peace and reconciliation. It contains within itself the healing power of the Most Holy Name of Jesus, invoked with faith and love at the center of each "Hail Mary".

Each bulletin issue of October will contain a message from me on the importance of the Holy Rosary. I also invite you to pray with us during the week of the Diocesan Rosary Congress, pleading the intercession of our Patroness, Mary of the Immaculate Heart for all our needs, the salvation of souls, and for peace and goodwill throughout the world.
