Dear Parishioners,

"For a child is born to us, a son is given to us; upon his shoulder dominion rests. They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:5)."

With these words the Prophet Isaiah heralded the coming of the Messiah who we recognize as Jesus Christ, the Second person of the Most Holy Trinity, God become man. A great mystery indeed! Or, as the old Medieval chant had it put: O Magnum Mysterium et admirabile sacramentum! ut animalia viderent Dominum natum, iacentem in praesepio! "O what great mystery and sacrament! That farm animals should see their Lord and creator born, and lying in a manger!"

The humility of Jesus should humble us. Our God did not have to come to us at all, in human form or otherwise. That he would humble himself to become like us, to be born a little child, mighty God yet fragile and vulnerable, should strike us profoundly. What God would go through such lengths to prove His love? A God who wants to be more than just our Lord, but also our brother.

How could we refuse such tender humility? Such radiant kindness? The God humanity has sought for centuries has come to us as a baby boy.

The Christ child still brings hope and joy to this sad world of ours. All who seek him sincerely and follow Him find peace and rest for their souls.

As this upcoming Christmas season continues into the next few weeks, I urge you to take some time to ponder this mystery of God's love. Don't take down your tree and decorations; leave them up a few weeks! The Christmas season begins on the 25th, it doesn't end. The presents may have been unwrapped, but what remains, and what will always remain to be unpacked for us is the great mystery of God's love, the profundity of what it all means for us to have a savior born for us.

Let's stay awhile in the stable with Mary and Joseph and the angels and shepherds. Allow their love for the infant King inspire us to meditate on all that God has done for us and all that we have yet to do for love of Him. May our hearts enlarge to allow this great mystery to form us and transform us. As God became man for love of us, may we strive to ever become more like God for love of Him.


