

Dear Parishioners,

Here's an Apostolic Constitution whose name I bet you can't say five times fast: Munificentissimus Deus (Moo-niff-i-sen-tee-see-moose day-oos) or "the Most Bountiful God." This was the proclamation by the Venerable Pope Pius XII in 1950 that the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, body and soul into heaven, was in fact not only a tradition to be held as a pious belief of the faithful, but in fact a dogma of faith. The proclamation underscores realities that the Church had already held firmly in her belief: the Mary is the mother of God, that she was sinless, that she is the perfect symbol of the Church, and that she, with her son, precedes creation in the glory that is to follow this mortal life. This Solemnity of the Church is now celebrated every year on August 15th.

As Pope Pius pointed out, belief in the heavenly assumption of Mary into heaven, was a belief widely held in the Church since the first centuries of Christianity, and like many doctrinal statements on the Eucharist, was not dogmatically defined with an official document until much later in the Church's history. Pope Pius quotes St. John Damascene, an early church father, in his belief of Mary's bodily assumption: "It was fitting that she, who had kept her virginity intact in childbirth, should keep her own body free from all corruption even after death. It was fitting that she, who had carried the Creator as a child at her breast, should dwell in the divine tabernacles. It was fitting that the spouse, whom the Father had taken to himself, should live in the divine mansions. It was fitting that she, who had seen her Son upon the cross and who had thereby received into her heart the sword of sorrow which she had escaped in the act of giving birth to him, should look upon him as he sits with the Father. It was fitting that God's Mother should possess what belongs to her Son, and that she should be honored by every creature as the Mother and as the handmaid of God."

Mary is our Mother and God's Mother also. Everything that the Church believes about Mary is merely a reflection of a belief we already hold about her Son Jesus: We believe Mary was immaculately conceived without original sin because Jesus came to earth to establish his Church and rid the world of sin, and Mary is the perfect example of this. We call Mary the Mother of God because she is the Mother of Jesus who is God, and whose divinity cannot be separated from his humanity. We believe that Mary was a perpetual virgin because like the Church she was especially espoused to God the Holy Spirit, who overshadowed her in a way unlike any other creature (Luke 1:35).

Furthermore, we should honor Mary if for no other reason than she brings us closer to her son Jesus. In imitating Mary's faith and love for Jesus, we grow closer to God, as St. John Vianney said: "Let us live as the Blessed Virgin lived: loving God only, desiring God only, trying to please God only in all that we do."

I ask you a simple question: When was the last time you prayed the rosary? Or the Angelus prayer? Through Marian prayers, our Mother Mary helps us to reach God. If we cannot have Mary for our mother, how can we be members of the Church?

May the Immaculate Heart of Mary, patroness of the Diocese of Steubenville, continue to intercede for us, and lead us to the eternal glory where she and her divine Son have gone before.
