

Dear Parishioners,

This Monday is the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, a day when honor this most beautiful devotion in the life of the Church, the rosary, which is also a great spiritual weapon against the evils of our troubled world.

The origin of the Feast is in the sixteenth century. Originally called the Feast of "Our Lady of Victory," It was instituted to commemorate the victory of the Catholic League over the Muslim Ottoman Sultan at the Battle of Lepanto on October 17th 1571. The Catholic League, comprising the Spanish Empire, the Italian City States and Papal States, as well as the Order of the Knights of St. John (today known as the Knights of Malta) was formed by Pope Saint Pius V to protect Christendom from the growing threat of the Muslim Turks who were threatening to invade Europe. This great naval victory by the Catholic League prevented the Ottoman Empire from spreading west into the Mediterranean.

Pope Saint Pius V attributed the victory of Christendom to the intercession of Our Lady, as he had urged all of Catholic Europe to pray the Rosary for the success of the Christian army. The legend of the rosary as a powerful weapon against the enemies of God grew, and devotion to our Lady's rosary continued to become more popular.

The Feast of Our Lady of Victory of the Holy Rosary is a powerful reminder to us of certain realities. The first is that Christ, His Mother, and the Church has enemies. Christ, His Mother, and the Church are hated throughout the world and in our own country, despised, ignored, and mocked. We are called to love our enemies, but we are also supposed to be defenders of the truth. With fortitude, courage, and zeal for the Lord and His Church, it is important now as ever to stand up for the truths of the faith as well as for the welfare of the Church. This battle is mainly spiritual, as Saint Paul says, "For our struggle is not with flesh and blood but with the principalities, with the powers, with the world rulers of this present darkness, with the evil spirits in (Ephesians 6:12)." So many people today are held captive by the Devil, enslaved by the vices or by ignorance of the truth. So many people today are in league with the devil in fighting the Church on marriage, abortion, and the freedom to practice and teach the faith. The Church is beset on all sides by enemies in this present world, spiritual and temporal.

We pray for our enemies, but we also must not let ourselves become overtaken by them, converted by them, or silenced by them. We have a responsibility as Christian soldiers to spread the Kingdom of Christ in this world, starting in our homes and communities. And we have an obligation to protect ourselves: Persons and families who do not pray are easy targets for the enemy! Homes where the rosary is not prayed are places where the devil can easily recruit Catholic children for his army. Don't let him win. In spiritual combat, we trust Our Lady's strength, and the power of the great spiritual weapon which is the rosary, because nothing is more terrifying to the devil and his friends than one who is totally devoted to Christ, Our Lady, and the Church. In the words of St. Padre Pio: "Love the Madonna and pray the Rosary, for her Rosary is the weapon against the evils of the world today."

Our Lady of Victory, pray for us!
